Passes may be purchased before or after school, or during lunch.

First Flight High School Parking Lot

Rules and regulations (revised July 1, 2016)

Dare County Schools has established that students must sign the drug pledge in order to be eligible for a parking permit

All parking on First Flight High School grounds is reserved. Students must park in their properly assigned space and will not be allowed to loiter in or around cars at any time. Students may not go to the parking lot during the school day unless they have received written permission from an administrator. The parking lot may not be used for hanging out after 8:10 AM.

PARKING PERMITS (ALL PARKING IS RESERVED)

All students who are licensed drivers can purchase a permit during lunch or before and after school on a first come, first serve basis. The permit must be attached to the front mirror facing outward for ease of accurate inspection. The following requirements are in place for the safety of our students:

This student must initial that he or she has read the following 5 directions: 1.) In order to park on school grounds during the school day, students must park the proper vehicle in the assigned parking space. Waiting or stopping at the curb is not permitted. All loading and unloading of passengers must take place in the assigned parking place. 2.) It is the responsibility of the individual student to ensure that his or her permit is displayed at all times during the school day when the vehicle is on school property. Permits are nontransferable. 3.) Students are not permitted to loan or give their permit to another person. 4.) Students are forbidden to use any parking permit that was not issued directly to them 5.) STUDENT PARKING PRIVILEGES MAY BE SUSPENDED OR REVOKED AT ANY TIME DUE TO STUDENT MISCONDUCT (SUCH AS CERTAIN VIOLATIONS OF THE DARE COUNTY SCHOOLS CODE OF CONDUCT AND / OR TARDIES TO CLASS). During the school day any student found to have parked in a space not assigned to him or her may lose driving privileges for up to 365 days from the time of the violation. The First Flight High School campus speed limit is 15 mph. Careless and reckless driving or exceeding safe speed will lead to revocation of driving privileges on campus and may result in a citation. Driving that is deemed to be reckless may result in the permanent loss of the driver's privilege. Tires squealing, disruptively loud music or "party-like" attitudes are inappropriate for school * Parking permits are required beginning with the second full week of school. On or after that Monday, do not park on school property unless your tag is in full display. The school retains authority to patrol student parking lots at any time without notice or consent. The interior of a student's motor vehicle parked on the school premises may be searched if a school official has reasonable suspicion to believe that illegal, unauthorized or contraband items are contained inside. The school is not responsible for damages to or theft of vehicles or property therein while parked on school grounds. Unauthorized parking on school property may result in the vehicle being towed at the owner's expense. Reminder from above: Any use of a pass not specifically assigned to the driver is strictly forbidden and is considered to be a hinderance to the safety of others. No switching, loaning, trading, or "passing on" of tags is permitted. Student Date

North Carolina State Highway Patrol Parent/Teen Driving Agreement



Car crashes are the leading cause of death among North Carolina teenagers.

In North Carolina, a teenager is involved in a crash every 23.6 minutes.

Even after many months of driving practice, when teens move from supervised driving to driving without an adult in the car, their crash rate increases sharply. This reflects the many crash risks that result from poor judgment, dangerous conditions and other things besides technical "driving skill" that are involved in crashes.

Fortunately, even though you are no longer in the car, there is still something parents can do to help protect their teen. This is where the *Parent/Teen Driving Agreement* comes in. The driving agreement helps make sure the driving conditions are as safe as possible for your teen even when you're not there.

What is a driving agreement?

It's a formal agreement between parents and teens. It includes specific things that *both* parents and teens agree to do. Parents have found that driving agreements work well to keep teens safe when they first begin to drive on their own by making expectations clear.

We Agree to Abide by the Driving to Live Contract

We Will:

- 1. Never drive a vehicle after consuming alcohol or any other impairing substance.
 - Never be a passenger in a vehicle with an impaired driver.
 - Always have a designated driver or call someone for a ride if I have been drinking alcohol or another impairing substance.
- 2. Always wear a seatbelt while riding in a vehicle.
 - Require all passengers to wear their seatbelts.
- 3. Never drive aggressively.
 - Always obey all traffic laws.
 - Allow plenty of following distance between vehicles.
 - Never drive recklessly
 - Avoid confrontations with other drivers
- 4. Obey the speed limit.
 - Remember that speed kills and is the leading cause of collisions.
- 5. Avoid driver distractions.
 - Avoid talking on the cell phone while driving. (Unlawful as of December 1, 2006)
 - Avoid adjusting the radio or CD player while driving.
 - Avoid applying makeup or grooming while driving.
 - Avoid eating while driving.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Parking on school grounds is a convenience, yet it is also a privilege! In order to decrease the number of first period tardies and to maintain school safety, we will be implementing a new procedure for those students who request and pay for a parking permit.

The school-wide expectation is that students will drive to school, park, gather their belongings, enter school and be on time for class. Loitering in or around cars is not acceptable and will not be tolerated. In addition, students who drive to school and continuously arrive late, resulting in excess tardies, will lose parking privileges.

We have several parking monitors who will write down the parking permit numbers for those students who are not following the expectations. This list will be turned in to the office on a daily basis. You and your child will both be contacted about the referral.

If your child accumulates 3 referrals, he/she will lose parking privileges for 2 weeks.

If your child accumulates 3 additional referrals, he/she will lose parking privileges for 4 weeks.

If your child accumulates 3 additional referrals, he/she will lose parking privileges for 8 weeks.
